This has been an exciting year of positive change for the Harbor Beach Lighthouse Preservation Society (HBLPS)! I would like to call this year our "Year of Transition". To start us off, we elected new members of office to lead us in our year of transition. I am so humbled to be elected as the President of the Society replacing our long-term President, Buzz Hoerr. I know that I have some big shoes to fill but I am up for the challenge! Other new members of office were elected including: Pam Semp as Vice President, Glen Townley as Treasurer replacing Dixon Kuhn, and Bob Letts was re-elected as Recording Secretary. The Society also made an organizational change by establishing a Board of Directors that includes: Buzz, Dixon, Pam, Glen, and I. As a team we hope to continue to drive change for our Lighthouse Society this year. In addition, Ron Kociba was named the Restoration Director replacing our Director of many years, Ron Klebba who recently moved to Oregon. We are thrilled to have Ron lead us with our future restoration projects and help us to preserve the many projects that have already been completed.

As we continue to restore the lighthouse and keep up with the necessary maintenance, we are going to put more energy into sharing our beautiful lighthouse with the public. The Society has always had a strong relationship with the city of Harbor Beach, but this year we saw it expand with the introduction of organized lighthouse tours. The city, through Recreation Director, Ron Wruble, hired the charter boat "J-Lyn" to transport guests to the lighthouse and the city acted as the fiscal agent for the ticket sales. We are planning to increase the number of tour guides for next year. This year we had a core group who entertained almost 300 guests. Next year we hope to double this amount and have over 600 guests so we will definitely need some more tour guides on board with us!

We know that marketing the lighthouse is extremely important for the future. We are currently exploring ways to promote our lighthouse and create venues for fundraising. We hope to start selling lighthouse related merchandise to our tour goers and promote our tours more heavily throughout Harbor Beach. I am excited that we have Pam Semp on board with us as she has many years of marketing experience and will help us reach these goals.

To help us reach our future goals and to continue to transition our gem we are going to need more volunteers. We are always looking for people to help in all aspects of the Lighthouse Society; maintenance and restoration, tour guides, marketing, grant proposals, communications, antique procurement and lighthouse and maritime research, just to name a few. If you would like to volunteer in any way we can always find something for you to do! I ask you to please talk to friends and neighbors and invite them to join us in preserving a piece of history right here in our own backyard.

We are going to have a very exciting year ahead and I hope to see many of you out at the lighthouse whether you are just visiting with your family or friends or picking up a paintbrush and getting to work!

A message from Society Vice-President: Pam Semp Summer 2011 Lighthouse Tours

A beautiful stretch of summer weather graced the thumb of Michigan in 2011. While it appears the area is still struggling with the economic woes prevalent in many areas of the United States, the Lake Huron shoreline community of Harbor Beach experienced a new burst of excitement and enthusiasm. The summer was highlighted by the inaugural season of tours of the Harbor Beach Lighthouse. A continued effort of more than 25 years of restoration and renovation by the HBLPS finally resulted in the first official tours of this historical structure. Tours were offered on Saturdays from 10am to 1pm, with a chartered boat ride by J-Lyn Charters and a guided tour of the break wall and lighthouse, costing \$20 per person.

The Harbor Beach Lighthouse is being restored to the 1900-1915-time period and also houses furnishings appropriate to that time. Guides provided guests with abundant information, helped with photo opportunities, including the favorite "through the porthole" shot on the observation deck and were able to answer questions about the harbor and the historic shoreline.

Almost 300 visitors took part in the Harbor Beach Lighthouse tours this season. Guests came from afar including; Texas, California, Massachusetts and Florida just to name a few! We also had guests from states nearby including Ohio, Indiana and from all parts of the state of Michigan. Many remarked that they had been waiting for this opportunity, with ties to the area, or a devotion to lighthouses; this was an opportunity that they savored. A family from downstate Michigan noted that they had seen our tour information in a "Sky Mall" magazine on an Air Tran flight to Florida. However if we can spread the word, the universal interest of lighthouses in general and specifically our historic Harbor Beach Lighthouse will ensure the tours to be a popular attraction for the City of Harbor Beach and the HBLPS for many years to come.

A Message from 2011 Restoration Director: Ron Klebba 2011 Lighthouse Preservation Society Summer Maintenance Program

This past summer we made more trips back and forth to the lighthouse than ever before! Several of those trips however had nothing to do with the actual "hands-on" maintenance work. We started our summer maintenance schedule with our usual routine of towing the floating dock out to the breakwall, installing the bracket bolts and putting the dock stairway in place. However, within a few weeks we were once again towing the dock back to shore for repair since one of the brackets securing the dock to the breakwall had a broken weld. The weld was repaired and once again the dock was towed out to the breakwall. Nevertheless within a few weeks we were once again towing the dock to shore for repairs. The broken weld had once again failed. This time the entire bracket was replaced. Success! Thanks to Ron Wruble and the city maintenance crew the dock was repaired and made it safely through the summer tour season.

Our onsite maintenance consisted primarily of painting, cleaning and installing the original foyer entrance door. I restored the door early in April and we installed it in June. We were fortunate enough to keep about half of the original door to the lighthouse. Ron Kociba designed and took charge of the installation of exterior lights on the gallery deck focusing on the lantern room. They are an excellent addition and it allows one to view the upper part of the lighthouse tower from shore after dark.

In addition our crew completed painting the ceiling of the workroom as our major painting project for the summer. Overall, we accomplished a lot of maintenance and restorative work on the lighthouse this summer and I hope that the hard work continues in the years to come.

As most of you probably know my wife Nadine and I moved to the Pacific Northwest in August. We are currently living in Portland, Oregon and have enjoyed being near our two children. We do however plan to spend our summer in Harbor Beach visiting family and hanging out with our fellow "marina rats". We'll return to Portland in the fall. I look forward to once again working on the Harbor Beach Lighthouse and enjoying some of that great "2 Hearted Ale" with friends at Smalley's bar in good old Harbor Beach.

We speak often of the dedication of the first citizens of Sand Beach who seized an opportunity and worked hard to bring the harbor project to their community. They created a legacy that has lasted nearly 140 years. Ron is in many ways like his forbears. He taught us the right way to restore a lighthouse, a way that will last. He has forever transformed the Harbor Beach Lighthouse into an historic treasure that will be around for generations to come. Words cannot express our gratitude for Ron's efforts.
